Dear Parents.

This packet may be used as a tool to encourage your child to dig deeper into God's Word while earning scholarship money to be used toward Summer Camp at Victory Valley! This past school year we have been teaching theology to our school age children on Wednesday nights, using the New City Catechism. Those children who have attended have been introduced to a series of questions and their corresponding answer that succinctly explain core elements of doctrine in language that is easy to understand. We believe it is crucial for every believer (children included) to be able to clearly explain the Biblical foundation for what they believe and these catechism questions are a great way to do that. Even if your child has not been exposed to the New City Catechism before, this Scholarship program will allow them to learn and memorize these truths in a fun way. This year the total scholarship of \$100 per child will be broken down into 2 separate categories: Memorization & Special Projects. **Both categories will need to be completed by May 26th.**

Memorization of Catechism

The following is a breakdown of what memorization will be expected of different age groups:

Special Projects

Every child will also have the opportunity to earn an additional \$25 scholarship by completing a project related to the catechisms memorized. They may choose 1 of the following catechisms below to create a project based on what they learned about God through that catechism. Below are some suggested project ideas, but feel free to allow your child to use their creativity! Songs, posters, models/artwork, creative written stories are all ideas of possible submissions.

The project MUST include accurate representation of the theology behind the selected catechism with at least 3 Bible references to support their material.

Catechism #	Project Ideas
Catechism #3 - The Trinity	Make different banners or a collage for Father, Son, & Holy Spirit and decorate with as many qualities as you can think of that apply to each. (ie. Helper=Holy Spirit or Savior=Son) Does an egg (shell, yolk, whites) or water (liquid, vapor, ice) accurately represent our 3-in-1 God? Make a song or rap about why or why not.
Catechism #4 - God Created Male & Female	Use toys (Barbies/Polly Pocket) to create a display that shows qualities of men vs. women and label how they reflect the image of God in different and special ways. Draw a giant outline of the human body and inside the outline list the ways that humans are unique as the only creation made in the image of
Catechism #7 - Love the Lord & Love Others	Come up with a service project to show love to someone you know. Write a paragraph about what you did and why we should love & serve others (don't forget biblical references!). Make a mobile with different objects that represent heart, soul, mind, strength. Attach to each object a verse that mentions loving God in that way, and a practical idea of how you can show that kind of love to God.
Catechism #8 - The 10 Commandments	Draw 2 comic strips showing what it would be like if we do follow God's laws, and if we don't. Create your own skit about how Moses received the 10 Commandments (include each commandment). Gather family and/or friends to perform and record a video of your skit (don't forget to include scripture references!).

Question 1

What is our only hope in life and death?

Long: That we are not our own but belong, body and soul, both in life and death, to God and to our Savior Jesus Christ.

Long: God is the creator and sustainer of everyone and everything. He is eternal, infinite, and unchangeable in his power and perfection, goodness and glory, wisdom, justice, and truth. Nothing happens except through him and by his will.

How many persons are there in God?

Long: There are three persons in the one true and living God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They are the same in substance, equal in power and glory.

Question 4 How and why did God create us?

Long: God created us male and female in his own image to know him, love him, live with him, and glorify him. And it is right that we who were created by God should live to his glory.

Question 5 What else did God create?

Long: God created all things by his powerful Word, and all his creation was very good; everything flourished under his loving rule.

Question 6 How can we glorify God?

Long: We glorify God by enjoying him, loving him, trusting him, and by obeying his will, commands, and law.

Short: By loving him and by obeying his commands and law.

Question 7 What does the law of God require?

Long: Personal, perfect, and perpetual obedience; that we love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and love our neighbor as ourselves. What God forbids should never be done and what God commands should always be done.

What is the law of God stated in the Ten Commandments?

Long: You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below—you shall not bow down to them or worship them. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony. You

Question 11 What does God require in the sixth, seventh, and eighth commandments?

Long: Sixth, that we do not hurt, or hate, or be hostile to our neighbor, but be patient and peaceful, pursuing even our enemies with love. Seventh, that we abstain from sexual immorality and live purely and faithfully, whether in marriage or in single life, avoiding all impure actions, looks, words, thoughts, or desires, and whatever might lead to them. Eighth, that we do not take without permission that which belongs to someone else, nor withhold any good from someone we might benefit.
